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SPRING BLOSSOMS & FLOWERS

DAY 1: BLOSSOMS & HIKING

The meeting point is a particular restaurant on the South Tyrolean **Wine Road** where we get together for a light lunch, including some wine and a professional presentation by a sommelier.

In the afternoon, the sunshine will tempt us to enjoy the sweet fragrance of an informal hiking trip with an orchard farmer, through a sea of blossoms. Afterwards we will visit one of the orchard farmer's co-operatives.

Did you know that in Spring when there is still some frost during the night, they switch on the surface sprinklers in order to protect the buds on the trees and that the entire valley solidifies into a bizarre ice world?

In the evening, we will drive back to the hotel in a wine village along the South Tyrolean Wine Road. An evening meal with fresh specialities awaits you at the hotel.

DAY 2: BICYCLE & ASPARAGUS

We begin in the morning with an easy cycle tour through a **sea of blossoms** between Meran and Bozen. The entire Etsch Valley offers traffic-free, flat cycling paths along the river Etsch, as well as agricultural roads with very little traffic. During springtime, from mid April to the beginning of May, hundreds of thousands of apple trees, as well as many Mediterranean trees and bushes begin to blossom.

Around midday, you really must visit one of the typical snack bars in the area and enjoy some cold meats with fresh horse-radish served on a wooden board.

In the afternoon, one special type of spring vegetable will be the centre of attention: we will learn how to harvest asparagus at an asparagus farm.

The menu for our evening meal presents us with an absolute South Tyrolean „must have“: Terlan asparagus with **Bozen sauce** accompanied by a glass of **Terlan Sauvignon**, a wine, which grows in the sun-kissed slopes, with a strong aroma. The experience, art and secrets of our cellar master will do the rest.

DAY 3: ARS VIVENDI & CULINARIUM

After a guided tour through the **county capital of Bozen**, we will go on a shopping trip – checking out all the new summer trends. The little streets of the historic centre invite us to an exclusive shopping experience. Lovely porticos built in the Middle Ages, the fruit market, stylish shops and elegant windows are one of Bozen's assets. Italian style, South Tyrolean cosiness, Gothic portico houses and the architecture of the Fascist 1930s: all of this brings two great European cultures together and creates a **fascinating mix**.

We will enjoy lunch in a typical restaurant in the historic centre of Bozen, where we will find some Italian cuisine, as well as Tyrolean eating culture. Fine Italian restaurants can be found just beside cosy Tyrolean pubs. Gourmet shops will entice you to buy some of the best ingredients as a holiday souvenir.

The afternoon is free. Our tip: visit **Ötzi**, the world-famous glacier mummy at the South Tyrolean Archaeological Museum or the famous 'Original Bozen Angels' at the Thuniversity.

In the evening, we will meet up for a pre-dinner drink at the Bozen **fruit market** at the old marble fish banks, the locals' cult meeting point.

Then we will enjoy an evening dinner at a smart trattoria in the historic centre of Bozen.

DAY 4: ROMANCE & ...

South of the two **Montiggl Lakes**, just below the little village of Montiggl, is the 'Frühlingstal' (lit. Spring Valley). Nowhere else will you find as many spring flowers during the month of March, as in the idyllic hollow of this valley. The Montiggl nature reserve with its beautiful mixed forests and two romantic bathing lakes invite you to stay and rest for a while.

Lunch will be served at a restaurant right at the shores of the lake ...



SUMMER HOLIDAYING

DAY 1: EARTH PYRAMIDS & HOLIDAYING

With the public transport from Bozen to Oberbozen on the **Ritten high plateau**. As far back as 400 years ago, the citizens of Bozen enjoyed their holidays on their local mountain.

We will enjoy a light lunch and some wines at a lovely mountain pub. With the **Ritten railway**, we will ride from Oberbozen to Klobenstein. The railway is still in service and is in its original since 1907. After a comfortable hiking trip, we will come to the earth pyramids, the highest and most beautifully formed of their kind in Europe. They consist of late-Ice Age moranic loamy soil, which turns into a type of mud whenever it gets mixed with water and then flows down into the valley. However, if a stone is found inside this loamy mix, it keeps the material below in a dry state. This then forms earth columns up to a height of 30 metres. Return journey and evening meal at the hotel.

DAY 2: LARCH MEADOWS & BATHING FUN

From the sunny and quiet village of Jenesien on the high plateau of the Salten mountain (approx. 1,100 metres), you will be able to enjoy wonderful panoramic views to the county capital of Bozen, which is only 7 miles away, as well as the neighbouring high-mountain ranges.

On the European 'distant hiking trail' at Gasthof Edelweiss in the direction of Langfenn, you will be able to discover the secret **legendary world**: twelve legends talking about the surrounding area, were illustrated by pupils of the Jenesien primary school. If you like, you can enjoy a horse-drawn coach ride on your return journey, through the meadows of the Hafling horses' local home.

We will take our lunch in a typical snack bar in the area.

In the afternoon, you can relax in the new swimming pools at **Lake Kaltern**: dive in and forget about the world around you. The warmest bathing lake in the Alps will enchant you with its incomparable panoramic views from the midst of a vineyard landscapes.

Evening meal at a restaurant directly at the lake.

DAY 3: CANYON & HAY BATHS

The entrance to the **Bletterbach** canyon near Aldein is quite adventurous. It's the geological attraction in South Tyrol.

Walking through the canyon with a professional guide is for every nature lover. It's simply a unique, historic experience. You will walk along water falls, the 'butter hole', the 'iron ladder', the 'Cephalopodenbank', along the Bletterbach stream to the end of the valley and through the forest up to the edge of the basin. On your left and right, porphyry walls will grow up to 20 metres. At the visitors' centre Geoparc, in which the development of the stones is impressively illustrated, you will also find some souvenirs, as well as specialised literature.

For lunch, we will stop at a typical **Alpine hut** and take a little time for sun bathing. A cold meat platter with speck, homemade cheese and butter, together with a glass of South Tyrolean Vernatsch wine or a fine Pinot Noir is recommended. As a dessert, there are Aldein poppy doughnuts and other local delicacies to choose from.

In the afternoon, you will get a chance to crown your holiday with an original hay bath experience at the Jochgrimm mountain, at an altitude of nearly 2,000 metres above sea level between the twin peaks of the Schwarzhorn and the Weisshorn. A bathing location full tradition, with fresh Alpine hay, will help you to purify your body, relax, invigorate yourself, underpin your immune system and take care of your general well-being. A health evening dinner with farming products will round off the day.

DAY 4: ICE HOLES & ...

The hiking trip will lead you from the main square of St. Michael/Eppan, passing several residences and castles, right into the forest. Soon, you will feel the cooling air from the ice holes: a range of gaps between the porphyry rocks, will create a constant flow of air, which in turn is cooled down along the way. About 600 different types of plants are the result of this enormous difference in temperature in such a small space of ground. For lunch, we will stop at a cosy pub ...



AUTUMN TÖRGGELEN

DAY 1: WINE & HIKING

We will meet for a light lunch with some suitable wines. In the afternoon, we will walk along the **wein.weg** (wine path) in **Kaltern**, which leads us along a bendy path to Lake Kaltern, passing vineyards and wine estates along the way. In order to make hikers aware of the many types of vineyards around, the ground is marked with sunk-in curbs. These read: 'Vial', 'Prunar', 'Puntara', 'Palurisch' ... – well-sounding names of Retho-Roman origin. The curbs are made of white limestone with letters out of metal. The point is made of porphyry. Limestone and porphyry are also a substance in the soil on which the vines grow. You can see the glow of the mountains all around Kaltern. Just a small distance away, hikers can enjoy some wonderful panoramic views and switch off from a busy life. The evening meal will be served in a typical **Törggele cellar**.

DAY 2: WINE RIDE & STORIES

Like fine 'wine knights' along about 2,000 years old roads in a comfortable mini bus. Part of our programme today is a **wine tasting** on some old wine estates and in old-fashioned wine cellars. We will meet with well-known **celebrities** from the South Tyrolean wine-growing scene, enjoy a typical snack with speck and cheese and will enjoy the **history and culture**. Wine has been cultivated in South Tyrol for more than 3,000 years. More than 85% of the entire South Tyrolean wine production comes from this climatically favourable region: White Burgundy, Chardonnay, Gewürztraminer, Kalterersee, Vernatsch, St. Magdalene, Lagrein, Pinot Noir, Merlot and the 'asparagus wine', the Terlan Sauvignon are only some of the many sign-boards.

The crowning finale: a 5-course **degustation menu** with a presentation of suitable wines in one of the best restaurants of South Tyrol.

DAY 3: CHESTNUT ROAD & TÖRGGELEN

The colourful autumn days invite you to hike from farmhouse to farmhouse and to stop and try some of their foodstuff and autumn delicacies.

Until the 20th Century, the **chestnut**, together with the potato, was one of the most important foods for the farming population. Due to its hardness, the wood was an ideal and stable material for building and the leaves were used to cover the ground in the barns. In order to preserve different **traditions**, the idea of the chestnut road was born. This road runs from Vahrn in the Eisack Valley down to Bozen and, as a theme path, illustrates the importance of the chestnut tree. The chestnut road runs across the **Ritten mountain** and is about 20 miles long (walking time: approximately 9 – 10 hours). Although hikers move across a high-plateau, there are still more than 1,000 metres of difference in altitude, which needs to be conquered.

Sights worth seeing along the way: ancient settlements, numerous chapels from different epochs, a Roman cemetery, castle ruins, as well as the Ritten landmark, the earth pyramids. Return journey and evening meal at the hotel.

DAY 4: ÖTZI & ...

Visit of the South Tyrolean Archaeological Museum, also called the 'Ötzi museum', situated in the historic centre of Bozen. It is the new residence of the approximately 5,400 year old man from the ice, a mummy from the Similaun glacier.

In this place, the entire history of our country from the Early Stone Age to the Carolinger Times is documented and illustrated by archaeological findings, models, holograms, videos and acoustic impressions.

Afterwards, we will jog-trot through the narrow lanes of the historic centre of Bozen.

What about lunch in the old walls? In one of the areas in Europe where you will find the most castles, the choice could easily turn into a chore ...



WINTER CHRISTMAS MARKET

DAY 1: CHRISTMAS MARKET & MULLED WINE

Around midday, we will arrive at a renowned Bozen town hotel and have some lunch with suitable wines.

After a **guided city tour**, we will visit the Christmas market in Bozen in the afternoon. This is the most traditional Christmas market in Italy – often copied, but never really truly matched. Nicely decorated stands present traditional hand-crafts, products of wood, glass, ceramics, beautiful Christmas tree decorations and even wonderfully tasting Christmas cookies. Should you still be on the look-out for Christmas presents, you surely will get some great ideas while enjoying a **shopping trip** through the narrow lanes of this wonderful town.

Sparkling decorations are found in the street and squares. The sound of hooves from the horse-drawn carriages comes up from the streets. The fragrance of roasted chestnuts entices you to try some of these delicacies. This wonderful atmosphere is crowned with the sounds of Christmas music.

During cold winter days, you will be able to warm up with a glass of mulled wine or apple punch, served in the original 'Christmas market' mugs, or you can enjoy some hot chocolate at the 'Sacherhaus'.

Evening meal at a typical restaurant.

DAY 2: SNOW & APRÈS-SKI

Snow-shoe hiking is the newest trend sport during the winter! After you have tried to walk with these huge shoes through the snow, you will understand why. With snow shoes, you will be able to experience winter in its purest form, conquer the powder snow area without any problem and reach new heights, which were only able to previously achieve are on ski tours. On these quiet soles, you can walk up high up into the mountains – and will be rewarded with breath-taking panoramic views.

Around lunchtime, we will stop at one of the Alpine huts, enjoy the sun, a calorie-rich meal (without a bad conscience) and play some cards or 'Poschn', a popular South Tyrolean dice game.

Evening meal in a unique mountain pub.

DAY 3: ALPINE ADVENT & TRADITION

The morning is free and if you like, you could discover the narrow streets of the historic centre of Bozen. Our tip: visit **Ötzi**, the world-famous glacier mummy.

Towards midday, we will leave for the Alpine Advent in the **Sarnatal Valley**.

When the snow falls quietly, the bells ring from the church tower, when the sweet fragrance of a Christmas bakery, mulled wine and cinnamon are in the air, then Christmas is near. During the quietest time of the year, we remember the wild and romantic Sarn Valley at Christmas, as it was many years ago. An enchanting world of time-honoured hand-crafts, generations of customs, steady Sarn hospitality: all found in the midst of an enchanting winter landscape. The Sarn Alpine Advent not only entices you with its farming traditions. Also long forgotten childhood memories will touch your heart ...

The choice of culinary delights on offer on the stands is practically fascinating and without limits.

In the evening, we will enjoy a wonderful meal in one of the unique, warm lounges of a chosen Sarn Valley restaurant.

DAY 4: CRIB EXHIBITION & ...

In the pre-Christmas season, the village of St. Pauls/Eppan with its 80 cribs in the local farmhouse windows, bay-windows and corners of historic houses, is South Tyrol's largest crib exhibition. Cribs of all shapes, forms and styles, true pieces of art and deluxe editions, show the great tradition of Tyrolean and Central European Christmas.

The highlight is a 'living crib', which will be presented several times. Like in a fairy-tale, you will enjoy the idyllic silhouette of this lovely wine village. The mighty Christmas tree in front of the church, as well as the colourful decorations and stars in the village streets create a special atmosphere ...



ARCHITECTURE & WINE

DAY 1: WINE-GROWING ESTATE ALOIS LAGEDER & HOTEL BAD SCHÖRGAU

We will meet to have a light lunch and a suitable wine.

In the afternoon, we will visit the wine-growing estate of Alois Lageder in Margreid. The wine cellars in this historic wine estate Löwengang were extended with a new building for production and administration (built in 1998, by architects Abram & Schnabel, Bozen) using the concept of **holistic agriculture**, through which people and the environment take centre stage. Also **art** plays an important part in this concept. For example, there is wind-activated sound installation for the barrels stored in the wine cellars, in which the individual wines ripen. The sound installation has a positive effect on the ripening process.

In the evening, after an adventurous tunnel drive through the wild and romantic Sarn Valley, we will arrive at Hotel Bad Schörgau. The rooms and suites of this hotel welcome you with a wooden fragrance. The cosy, award-winning restaurant and the bathing house with its own water spring, offer you a surprising harmony between Alpine architecture and modern design.

Your evening meal will consist of wonderful specialities such as ravioli filled with dwarf pine pesto.

DAY 2: EURAC & MANINCOR

In the morning, we will visit the European Academy of Bozen (built in 2002, by architect Klaus Klada, Graz). The order for this impressive complex was given by the Fascist government between 1934 and 1936 and it was intended for use by the female Fascist youth movement. This listed building is now attached to a contemporary architectural structure of glass, concrete and steel. The artist Manfred Alois Mayr from the Vinchgau region designed the colour concept for the interior architecture.

After this, we will enjoy a guided tour through the historic centre of Bozen, where we will also have our lunch.

In the afternoon, we will visit the wine-growing estate Manincor, which is situated in the midst of a picturesque mountainous landscape near Lake Kaltern. The barely visible new wine cellar building is true evidence of how sensibly we can build

with the environment in mind, taking care and building a bridge between the vineyards and a new building. Functionality and the maximum uptake of underground resources, as well as a simple, but complex structure were the main components of this idea. The project from the architectural team of Angonese/Köberl/Boday was built from 2002 to 2004. Enjoy your evening meal at Lake Kaltern.

DAY 3: MMM FIRMIAN & WINECENTER KALTERN

In the morning, we will visit the MMM Messner Mountain Museum Firmian (built in 2006). This is the centre piece of the museum project by extreme mountaineer **Reinhold Messner**. In the old walls of Castle Sigmundskron, completed with a modern structure of glass and steel and designed by the young architect Werner Tscholl from Morter, Reinhold Messner talks about the importance of the mountains for mankind.

Lunch – a typical snack in the castle's restaurant.

In the late afternoon, we will enjoy an aperitif at the Winecenter in Kaltern (built in 2006, by the architect office „feld72“, Vienna). This challenging project is marked by a structural dialogue with the old walls built in 1911.

You will enjoy an evening meal at the Restaurant **Castel Ringberg**, situated in the midst of vineyards, with a view of Lake Kaltern. In the summer, the panorama terrace invites you to enjoy the views. During the winter, dinner is served inside the castle's stylish ball rooms. Enjoy the varied, Mediterranean and creative cuisine.

DAY 4: SWIMMING POOLS AT THE LAKE & ...

We will visit the swimming pools of Seebad Kaltern (built in 2005/2006, by the architect office „The Next Enterprise“, Marie-Therese Harnoncourt and Ernst J. Fuchs, Vienna), a leisure world far away from water slides and wave machines. The architects lifted the pool area out of its usual bed: the free-standing roof with an integrated outdoor swimming pool and views in the surrounding landscape push open the borders between the swimming pool area and the garden.

Lunch at the lake.



VINEYARDS & WINE TASTING

DAY 1: VINEYARDS & HIKING TRIPS

We meet at a chosen restaurant at the South Tyrolean Wine Road for a light lunch with some suitable wines.

In the afternoon, we will enjoy a professionally guided hiking trip along the wine teaching trail of Kurtatsch, which leads us for about 1 mile through the vineyards of the surrounding area. Here, you will come across almost all the types of grapes grown in South Tyrol, as well as the different types of cultivation methods, amongst them – the typical South Tyrolean pergola. You will learn that there are a lot of interesting details to be discovered about wine cultivation.

Of course, there will also be the opportunity for some wine tasting. In the interesting world of fine wines, we will learn a lot about wine tasting techniques, recognising faults relating to wines, the correct storage for wine bottles, the perfect wine glass, best drinking temperatures and much more.

In the evening, we will drive back to the hotel to enjoy our evening dinner.

DAY 2: SPARKLING WINE & ROCKS

In the morning, we will go to a **tasting seminar** of a special kind and learn how to properly distinguish between wine fragrances. This is followed by an aperitif at Arunda-Vivaldi in Mölten, Europe's highest-altitude sparkling wine estate. Afterwards we will have lunch in Mölten or Terlan.

In the afternoon, we will visit the **Landeskellerei Laimburg** (provincial wine cellars of Laimburg) and their rock cellars – built at the end of the 1980s, when the company realised that it was necessary to build an extension. As the wine cellars were already built close to the rock, an extension right into the mountain seemed to be ideal. Therefore, a barrique cellar and a cellar for storing the wine bottles, with a naturally consistent temperature were built right into the red-brown porphyry rock. In addition, a 300 m² large room was bombed out of the rock and is now used for official presentations of South Tyrol as a wine land, as well as an asset for the South Tyrolean government as a representation area. The design comes from the Bozen surveyor Nori Gruber. The two Bronze wine figures at

the entrance were created by the artist Guido Anton Muss and they represent the slim-line elegance, as well as the opulent strength of our wines.

For the evening meal, we will visit a chosen restaurant in the Lowlands.

DAY 3: WINE TASTING & TIME TRAVEL

For more than 3,000 years, wine has been cultivated in the South of South Tyrol. More than 85% of the entire South Tyrolean wine production derives from this climatically strengthened area: Pinot Bianco, Chardonnay, Gewürztraminer, Kalterersee, Vernatsch, St. Magdalene, Lagrein, Pinot Noir, Merlot and Sauvignon are only some of the best-known.

Today, we will enjoy varied **wine tasting** on some of the old wine estates and in well-known wine cellars. For lunch, we will have a typical local **snack with speck and cheese**.

In the afternoon, we will visit the museum 'Zeitreise Mensch' and be transported back in time to see the fascinating life of people living in different periods, with the opportunity to see more than 5,000 pieces of archaeological findings, as well as typical tools these people worked with. Of particular interest is the insight into the changes in wine cultivation.

The crowning touch: a 5-course degustation menu with a presentation of suitable wines in a renowned restaurant.

DAY 4: COOKING POLENTA & ...

The traditional preparation of polenta is very simple but takes some strength. Maize flour is slowly poured into boiling salt water. Then, this porridge-like mixture needs to be constantly stirred into the same direction – for 1 hour, in order to get a smooth consistency and to ensure that it does not burn. Along the wall of the pot, a popular brown crust is forming. Once the polenta process is completed, the polenta is poured onto a damp wooden board and cut into thick slices, using a strong thread. You can also leave the polenta to cool and then cut it into slices, which can be heated in butter or on the grill ...



ACTIVE SPORTS & MORE

DAY 1: HIGH-CLIMBING ROPES & BARE FEET TRAILS

We will meet for a light lunch in Terlan.

In the high-climbing ropes 'Hetz' in Terlan, we will climb and learn to balance in a world of ropes, wooden beams and hanging bridges.

If you prefer to keep your feet on the ground, you can do the bare feet trail. With your bare feet, you will experience a range and variety of experiences: cool soft grass, warm sand, cosy moss, massaging rind from the trees, whispering leaves and all temperatures, sounds and smells from different seasons.

We will drive back to the Wellness hotel, enjoying a visit to the sauna and our evening meal.

DAY 2: CYCLING & WELLNESS

Numerous paths run through the Sarn Valley and lead you to beautiful farmhouses, Alpine huts and mountain huts. Beginners and mountain freaks will find a challenge in the Sarn Valley Alps. Before you get onto your bike, prepare yourself for steep ascents and a difference in altitude of at least 600 to 700 metres.

Enjoy your lunch in a typical **mountain hut**.

In the afternoon, Hotel Bad Schörgau will present you a treat. They have gone back to some of the century-old farming traditions and re-activated a different type of bathing culture. The comfortable bathing area avails of a water spring with iron, phosphor and minerals. Some additional highly valued 'water ingredients' come from the farmers of the Sarn Valley: fragrant Alpine hay, honey and rich milk. Particular importance is given to the **Sarn drawf pine – Original Pinus Saren-tensis**, a renowned and natural 'farmers medicine'. In particular, the oil with its characteristic forest fragrance brings your body, soul and spirit to life and stimulates circulation.

Evening meal at the award-winning restaurant of your hotel.

DAY 3: CLIMBING & RELAXATION

South Tyrol is a country of various types of activity. If you are looking for the Eldorado for climbing enthusiasts, then look no further than the climbing gardens of 'Marderwand' between Kurtatsch and Graun, the 'Unterlegstein' in Fennhals, the 'Sefnar Plottn', the 'Tanzbach-Knottn' and the 'Sarner Scharte' in the Sarn Valley, as well as the climbing garden in Truden.

Difficult but rewarding is the climbing path, which leads you from Margreid to the Fennberg mountain. The difference in altitude is about 750 metres. Total walking time is 5 hours. Once you reach your destination, you will enjoy the unique, beautiful and relaxing region, as well as Lake Fenn, where you can take a bath. After lunch at the Fennberg, simply enjoy the sunshine and quietness around you.

Evening meal at a chosen restaurant in the South Tyrolean Lowlands.

DAY 4: NORDIC WALKING & ...

Nordic Walking was developed as a summer training method for top athletes, in cooperation with the world's largest carbon stick manufacturer 'exel'. This type of sport is most beautiful and effective in slightly hilly regions. Use the walking sticks when doing some Nordic Walking and your knees and back will be released from too much stress, which makes this sport very interesting for people, who usually would experience difficulty in walking. Through the movement of the sticks, tension in your shoulder and neck region is released.

In a good Nordic Walking course, you will learn special forms of walking, such as small steps, long steps, jumping or amended use of the sticks.

Some strength-giving snacks await tired sportsmen in a restaurant.
